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PREFACE TO THE FIRST EDITION: *The Author's 1994 Thoughts on the Book you Are Reading*



This book has been more than eight years in the making, from its original conception in 1985 to the form in which it now appears. In its earliest draft in 1987, with the title “The New Babel”, it was an idea before its time, exposing trends which most Christians had never experienced, and of which many had never even heard. At that time, the New Age Movement was hardly known this side of the Atlantic, and such a dark view of the world and of today’s churches would not have been readily accepted in many Christian circles. Having been dissuaded from pursuing the project any further, I embarked on four years of intensive study at theological college. However, there was a wise providence in this delay; for I had a great deal more to learn and discover before the time would be ripe for publication.

It was my personal experience during the ensuing years which made me realise the need to revive this work. During my time at college and as a result of being involved with a number of churches, I became convinced that there was the need for far greater understanding and discernment concerning the meaning of the term “occult”.

In many Christian circles, the occult is perceived as consisting exclusively in Ouija-boards, séances, Hallowe’en, and open worship of the devil. Dangerous as these activities are, I propose to show that they act as ‘smoke-screens’ to obscure the *real* occult — the true extent of which many Christians seem to be completely unaware, either through natural or wilful ignorance. The second impulse to revive the book was the discovery that so many satanic influences which I had renounced on becoming a Christian were gaining increasing popularity within the Church and upheld as valid

Christian experience. When people run into a burning building filled with explosives, the knowing onlooker can do only one thing: sound a clear alarm. This book is that alarm.

A cosy, ‘chocolate-box’ Christianity has been propagated by the mainline churches for long enough, with its associated illusion that the Church can cooperate with the world in order to bring about an age of “peace and justice”. Many have forgotten what true discipleship involves, and from what it is that believers have been rescued.¹ **There is a ministry of discernment necessary today which involves the methodical undeceiving of the sheep from this stultifying mindset.** In this way, the Church will be equipped to stand its ground and continue to fulfil the Great Commission commanded by the Lord Jesus Christ.² Paul the Apostle would not have us ignorant of Satan’s devices,³ and this book seeks to conform to that noble desire.

As soon as one begins to cut through the surface of human movements and world events, one discovers that they are not how they appear to the undiscerning eye. The word “occult” means hidden. Behind the facade of many developments, one will discover the evil designs of fallen angels headed up by Satan, that arch-enemy of all that is good and godly.

So when the Holy Scriptures tell us that *“our struggle is not against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the powers of this world’s darkness, and against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly realms”*,⁴ this is not merely an admonition about the struggle with temptation to personal sin. It is a clear-sighted overview, through the medium of Divine revelation, of the cosmic backcloth to a titanic struggle which has continued since the beginnings of human history. This struggle began with the murderous lies of a serpent and climaxed in the life-giving Truth on a Cross. It was a movement from human catastrophe to Divine victory.

Although the means have taken many forms, the aims of the satanic realm have remained constant from the outset. Old heresies simply reassert themselves in different guises. More than eighteen hundred years ago, Irenaeus of Lyon sought to expose the Gnosticism of his era in his book, *“The Refutation of what is Called Falsely Knowledge”*. In the introductory note to a modern translation of this work, A. Cleveland Coxe states that Irenaeus’s principal task was twofold: *“To render it impossible for anyone to confound Gnosticism*

with Christianity, and to make it impossible for such a monstrous system to survive, or ever to rise again".⁵

Although he certainly succeeded in his first aim, the sad fact is that the monstrous system of Gnosticism has never been laid to rest. Instead, it went underground and lay deceptively dormant for many centuries; and during the past one hundred and thirty years it has resurfaced in modern clothing with a vengeance. For just as the Gnostic movement of the first and second centuries burst upon the Church with singular ferocity as an expression of the rage and malice of Satan after his defeat by the Lord Jesus Christ, so we are witnessing in our own day the resurgence of this rage as a backlash against the mighty progress of the Gospel during the four hundred years since the European Reformation.

Contrary to the fashionable thinking of many in the churches today, this present book, therefore, sets out to show that the development that people call the New Age Movement is not just a cult which has suddenly blossomed at the end of the twentieth century. Neither is it confined to a small number of naïve idealists in search of a spiritual utopia. For it has pervaded a great many areas of cultural life today — science, the arts, the media, medicine, education, churches, business and world government — and is ardently promoted by the Princes, Presidents and Prime Ministers of many lands. The entire concept of a 'New Age', with its political counterpart the 'New World Order', fulfils every ambition of Satan in his long war against God and in his futile kingdom-building on earth.

Unless these modern religious developments can be seen in their historical (as well as their biblical) context, we will not grasp the true significance of their purpose in the world today. In so many of the current, modern antichristian influences — including those of the New Age Movement — we can see all the hallmarks of the ancient heresy of Gnosticism. Indeed, after studying the extent to which these influences have pervaded society today, one can only conclude that we are living in a Gnostic world. We are now living in a culture which scoffs at the devil, demons, angels, miracles, and Messiah of the Bible, yet which earnestly embraces the concepts of ETs, UFOs, spirit-guides, earth mysteries, cosmic consciousness, mind-control, leyline-portals, magic, witchcraft, self-hypnosis, spiritism, astrology, parapsychology, and a quantum leap in human 'evolution' leading to a 'Golden Age' on earth. *The Serpent and the Cross* is an encyclopaedic exposé of

the historical development and vast modern growth of this ‘New Gnosticism’, in both the secular world and within the professing Church.

The description of this present age as being “evil”, as in the subtitle of the book, may appear somewhat pessimistic to many people; but this is the specific label given to it in the New Testament by the Apostle Paul,⁶ to say nothing of the general remarks of both the Lord Jesus Christ and His Apostles.⁷ As this ‘evil age’ draws to its inevitable climax — the crisis-point of cosmic history — this book has been written in the prayerful hope that it will fulfil three purposes:

First, my heart’s desire is for the equipping of the saints that they may be wise, discerning, and knowledgeable apologists who will not be dumbstruck by the widespread delusions disseminated in the world and among the churches today. Every believer should feel great optimism concerning God’s saving work in the world, and an undergirding confidence that the victory is (and always has been) His alone.

Second, I see a great need to dispel the rife but erroneous notion that the world is building up to a glorious era of “peace and justice” on earth. To cling to that illusion will only bring heartache and bewilderment as the harrowing events of the coming years inevitably unfold.

Third, and above all other aims, I want to give supreme glory to our great God and Saviour at a time in earth history when His holy name has been horridly eclipsed by a defiant and blasphemous quasi-religious humanism. This book could never have been accomplished without His continual encouragement — sometimes through the most unexpected of human instruments. Neither could its completion have been achieved without His invincible protection from the dark forces which have so often, like Bunyan’s Apollyon, stood menacingly in the way of my labours.

A good deal of prayerful consideration has gone into the making of this book, and it is with the greatest trepidation that I send these words out into the world.⁸ If you find that there is anything of value in them, account it to the work of my Master. All the rest — the ramblings, ruminations and inevitable wrongnesses — are mine alone; and for these I ask your forbearance.

PREFACE TO THE SECOND EDITION: *The Author's 2025 Thoughts on the Book you Are Reading*



The first edition of *“The Serpent and the Cross”* has long been out of print, especially since the passing of Michael Kimmit, the astute and gentlemanly publisher at K & M Books in Birmingham, UK, who had the courage to publish it in 1994. So here I present a completely revised and updated second edition. As the original text dates back more than 30 years, having been written in long-obsolete software, I have only been able to retrieve it as vast blocks of semi-formatted text, sometimes with no clear paragraph markers, so each chapter has had to be formatted paragraph by paragraph with the thousands of footnote references needing to be individually reassembled. However, I believe that it has been a worthwhile pursuit, and it has been encouraged by many.

I have been amazed at the extent to which what I wrote about between 1985 and 1993 — often spending many long-hour days doing research (with no internet, so all in hardcopy through notetaking) in well-stocked libraries such as the National Library of Scotland in Edinburgh or the Bodleian Library in Oxford — has all these years later been shown to have developed just as predicted. Nothing has changed for the better and the darkness has only deepened, while this mostly godless world must surely now be ripe for some far-reaching global developments (which will really be Divine judgements in disguise, if those developments are perceived correctly).

A lot of water has passed under the bridge since I wrote the first edition. In personal terms, the original publication of *“The Serpent and the Cross”* cost me a great deal — and I do not mean financially. I was relatively naïve in those days and still had much to learn (and I still do!). In academic circles, the

responses to the book ranged from 1) A ‘celebrated’ theology professor pointedly handling my partially-completed manuscript in 1989 with as much disgust as if it were a piece of used toilet paper, to 2) A courageous professor of Greek and New Testament in a Reformed theological seminary in the USA inviting me in 1997 to give a lecture tour over there, purely as a result of the contents of the book. That was a revealing contrast!

Even though I had written a huge tome about the working of the forces of darkness throughout the ages, I was still so naïve at that stage of my journey that I never anticipated the demonic backlash which would occur in my own life as a result of it — and not only the result of that but also as a result of my determined, uncompromising pulpit-stance denouncing the so-called “Toronto Blessing” which had burst onto the church scene in the same year as the publication of the first edition of *“The Serpent and the Cross”* and it was plainly a manifestation of the same neo-Gnosticism about which I was writing in the book.

When I first came to Christ and encountered church life, I thought I had entered the ‘suburbs of heaven’; but I had failed sufficiently to discern the difference between the body of Christ and the ‘visible church’. I eventually became disillusioned with the church scene in general, not only because of the backlash and the fallout described above, but also because of my discovery that people calling themselves ‘Christians’ (falsely or not, I do not know) could be so nasty, spreading lies and gossip at the drop of a hat because they disagreed with some aspects of my teaching, or because I wasn’t a fan of theirs or, in one case, because I referred to myself as a “troubadour”! As a result of all this and more, I entered an acute spiritual crisis and dark night of the soul which took its toll on my spiritual life for a number of years, beginning around 2011, although I had felt it stirring a few years earlier.

During the ensuing years of semi-wilderness wandering, I absorbed myself in the world of music composition and performance, mostly in Sweden, which was an educational part of my journey in many ways and through which I learned a great deal about the state and direction of my own heart as well as the ways of the world. However, throughout that time, the underlying thread of faith was always there, but with an element of conundrum which was both confusing and debilitating. To overcome this quandary, I had to go right back to the drawing-board of faith and re-establish the building-blocks on which it had its original foundation, independent of any church or humanly-organised setting; and it paid off in many surprising ways. When I got wholly back on track in the year 2017, I began writing again and eventually reestablished my moniker of ‘Diakrisis’ (which is the Greek word for “discernment” — being able to judge between choices) with the establishment of the ‘Diakrisis Project’ website. **Interestingly, I found that**

I was stronger and more determined than ever before in the ground of my now newly bolstered and unfettered faith.

Since that time, no matter what adversity I could possibly encounter in life, I have been in a state of mind in which I know that I have nothing whatsoever left to lose and everything to live and die for. I now experience a freedom in Christ which I never had to this extent before and have become immune to the human foolishness which seems to be so endemic in the ‘visible church’ scene. Having written more than five hundred articles and fourteen books since then,⁹ I further crystalized this renaissance in the fulfilment of a long-desired ambition through the writing of a commentary on the Book of Revelation, completed in its eBook first edition in 2022 and a second edition in 2024, now available in both eBook and physical paperback formats.¹⁰

I realise now that in one way or another all those books and articles are continuations of everything that I was writing about in “*The Serpent and the Cross*” which I initially began writing nearly forty years ago using my own huge library of mystical, esoteric, psychological and neo-Gnostic literature from my pre-conversion life as the initial research material. I can honestly say that the first edition of this book and everything else that I have written since its publication are interchangeably linked. The underlying caveat, from that first edition of the book onwards, has been this:

That this present creation is not building up to a euphoric utopia, ‘Golden Age’, ‘global revival’, or one-thousand-year reign of Christ on this present earth, but it is degenerating into a debauched dystopia, just as it was in the days of Noah before the Flood and in the days of Lot in the city of Sodom, as the Lord Jesus revealed that it would be,¹¹ in which evil masquerading as ‘good’, and chaos masquerading as “peace and safety”,¹² will come to their inevitable climax so that after a Divine cosmic intervention of cataclysmic proportions, a new creation can finally be inaugurated.

The qualification right now in this present fallen creation for becoming part of that new creation (which will be the kingdom of God in its full consummation) is to renounce being a part of this satanic world-system, to cease leading a godless way of being, to turn one’s life around completely and

to pledge oneself wholly to being a disciple of the Christ, God manifested in the flesh, who came to this earth to overthrow the fallen archangel Satan and all his works — primarily, sin, deception and death,¹³ which will be wholly ratified when the Lord Jesus Christ returns. To have all that initiated in your life is the great work of God in the hearts of humans which is known as ‘repentance’, or *metanoia* in the Greek, when the carpet is pulled out from under one’s old, ignorant and spiritually dead way of life and recarpeted with one fashioned in all the “*newness of life*”.¹⁴ If you are reading these words out of curiosity but have not yet become a disciple of Christ, I urge you to apply this paragraph to yourself, to call on the name of the Lord and follow its proposed pathway. As a result of that, the rest of this book will mean so much more to you.

Therefore, writing the subject matter of this book, or any of the other books and articles I have written, is not merely a gruelling indulgence in exposing darkness but is also an urgent forthtelling to the world about the need to be undeceived by that darkness and to be dedicated to the Source of all Light, the Divine Logos who came to gather in the population of the new creation to come, the *true* new age which has been hideously counterfeited by the New Gnosticism which you will find copiously revealed within the pages of this book, as manifested in both the secular world and in the ‘visible church’.

The text of the first edition of “*The Serpent and the Cross*” has almost all been preserved. If any of the original research material has not come up to the highest standard of irrefutability (for example, if the citations are no longer in existence), it has been erased. I have subjected my text to the utmost scrutiny, and my proofreaders have been encouraged to adopt the same approach and to leave no stone unturned. More recent research material has been inserted where necessary so as to bring the book up-to-date. There has also been much additional general material weaved into the main text, where appropriate, leading to a 43% increase on the first edition in the number of words in the book.

I commit the new edition of this book to you in the sincere hope that it will either strengthen your current faith and bolster your discernment, or be a human nudge toward the miracle of faith taking root in your heart for the first time.

In 1994, the first edition of this volume was reviewed favourably by several stalwarts of the faith. In the Church, society, and worldwide culture, there had been changes before the first edition was published and arguably those changes have often accelerated in the time since then. Hence the need for a revised and updated edition.

One of the great strengths of this volume is the way in which the roots (often occult or satanic) of different streams are identified. So science has become increasingly and often militantly atheistic in its underlying philosophy. This is also reflected in art and virtually every other subject of study.

The author’s argument taken as a whole from the falsifying of origins to the planned future is compelling and holds together consistently. It is particularly helpful to see ‘the great reset’ biblically evaluated and critiqued as it is to see the way in which modern science can effectively take on board witchcraft. Science fiction often becomes magical implicitly, but here, as Alan shows, science itself has been influenced.
